## Encryption Controls Vital to Protecting American Technology Featured on Science News Radio

Upcoming seminars by the International Trade Center (Small Business Development) will also answer licensing questions

Dallas, Texas, Jan. 26, 2009. Lorraine McCord, Director of the International Trade Center, a government agency located in Dallas, Texas, says the US is increasingly vigilant to prevent the loss of our trade secrets. For these reasons our important import-export commerce can be adversely affected when firms do not know the rules.

Ms. McCord made her comments while recording for a radio program to be aired Sunday, February 1. Her comments feature the importance of protecting US technology secrets in an ever shrinking world.

The radio program, *The Promise of Tomorrow* with Colonel Mason, is aired in Dallas and Fort Worth with a possible audience of over two million, then archived on the Web to an audience that is world-wide. McCord will explain how the International Trade Center works and how it has vital information for small businesses planning to develop viable export/import avenues. The International Trade Center has scheduled two seminars on the subjects of Licensing Requirements and Encryption Controls to be held in Dallas February 24-26. The radio program on which McCord will make her comments studies the commercial business of emerging science and nanotechnology, and has a history of keeping abreast of breaking commercial advances, all archived at the program's website. "February is lining up to be another exciting and informative month," said Colonel Mason, the program's creator and host, "we see startling revelations that will affect mankind on every level. Like this month the program will reveal the roadmap on how we will get off fossil fuels almost entirely in 20 to 30 years with a crash Apollolike program," said Mason, "drastically slowing global warming and ensuring dramatic economic growth around the world, a pretty comforting thought in these current times."

The award-winning creator and host of the program is veteran news reporter, Colonel Mason.
